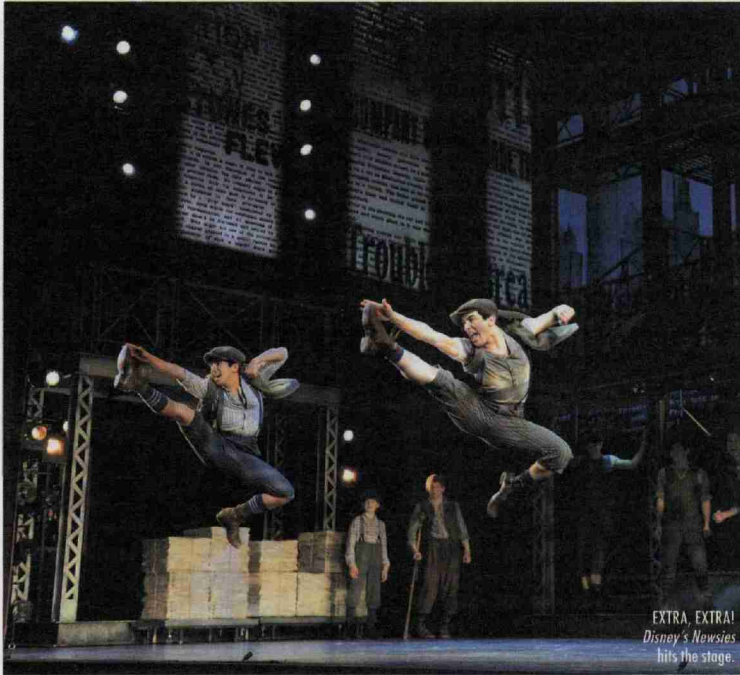
Ragtime

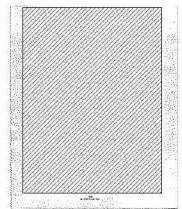
