US Antique Shows will once again partner with Skinner Auc-

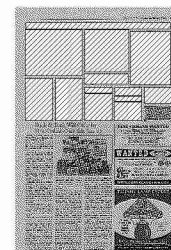

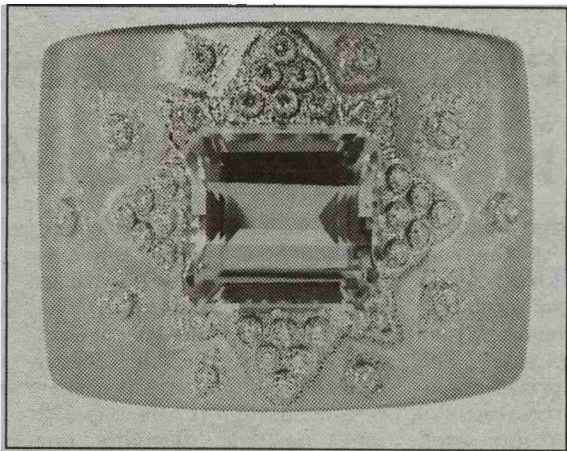
Show times for the 2015 show are Friday to Monday from noon to 8 pm and Tuesday, noon to 5 pm. Admission is \$20 to attend all five days.

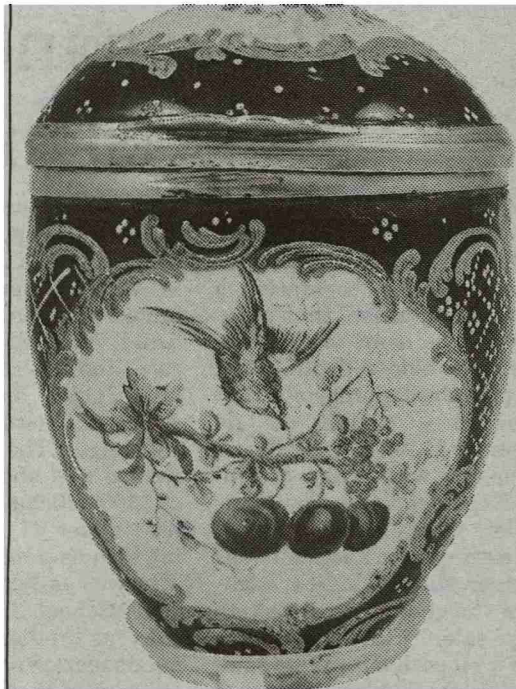
