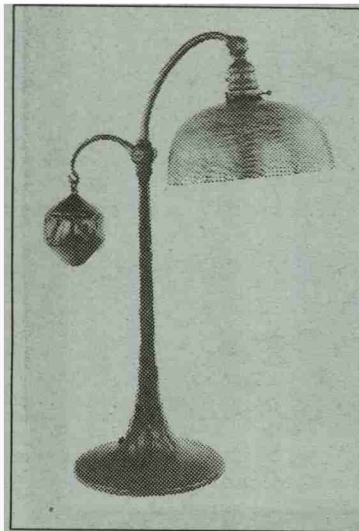

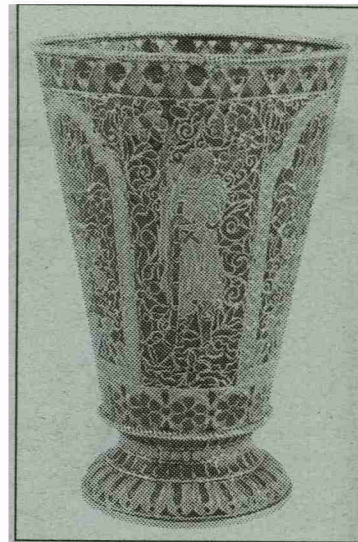

A turtleback tile counter balance table lamp by Tiffany Studios, circa 1910. Represented by Ophir Gallery.

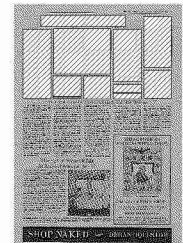
